Scientific Instruments at Museo Galileo

Duration: 60 minutes

This remote-learning session will introduce students to the sundial, navigational instruments, early astronomical tools like the nocturnal, armillary sphere and conclude with the arrival of the Age of Enlightenment's interest in static electricity machines. ON SITE VISITS AT MUSEO GALILEO

Simple Group Entrance (Non-guided Visit): Reservations are required for all scholastic and group visits of 15 persons or more. There is no booking fee and the reservation is considered valid only after receiving a confirmation. Large groups will need to be divided into separate groups due to safety and space limitations.

Group Discount Entrance Fees: Groups of 15 people age 15 and under pay € 5,00 per person while groups of those age 16 years and over pay € 6,00 each. A maximum of 2 teachers per scholastic group enter for free.

Discount Family Ticket: Two adults and two children ages 6 through 18 enter for 24 Euro. Children under 6 are free.

Guided visit fees for scolastic groups: There is an additional charge of € 3,00 per person for each educational activity.

Private Visits and Fees: Small, private groups up to 10 people can also book any of the visits in person at Museo Galileo. Advanced reservations are required and times are subject to availability.

All applicable museum entrance fees plus a flat rate of € 65 for the activity.

General Guided Visit: 60 minutes

This 60-minute guided visit through the two main floors of the museum will highlight the most important instruments of the collections while discussing their historical-scientific significance and how they were used by demonstrating a few replicas along the way.

Recommended for all ages and groups.




Experiential Visit: 90 minutes

This popular visit is meant to stimulate one's interest in the history of science. The Museum's guide accompanies the group through the permanent collection explaining the historical context and functions of the instruments. Several demonstrations are performed along the way.

Recommended for all ages and groups.




Life and Works of Galileo: 60 minutes

Our Galileo expert will accompany the group through the Medicean collection on the 1st floor where they can admire the original instruments of Galileo Galilei including his two surviving telescopes. This thematic visit highlights the times, life, works and discoveries of Galileo which influenced the religious, philosophical and scientific worlds.

Start time is per request and availability.

Recommended for all ages who have an interest in Galileo.



History of Medicine: 90 minutes

This visit looks at the permanent collections through the eyes of medicine starting with the Greek physicians up to 18th Century Florence.

The visit highlights the development of obstetric medicine through the use of anatomical wax models and pharmacy through chemistry benches and portable medicine boxes. Start time is per request and availability.

Recommended for those with an interest in medicine and the scientific method.
